


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Introduction of the program

Dhangadhima Municipality is one of the UNICEF accelerating sanitation and water for all (ASWA-II) program implementing palika in Siraha District where 14 wards with 49,449 population. UNICEF and Palika agreed to implement this program Only 5 wards of palika out of 14 wards. After implementing ASWA-II program Municipality has adopted and reflected this model in remain 9 wards with human resource and financial resources. The sample house hold survey by UNICEF field office Bharatpur 2018 through consulting partner BIJAM has seen 25.28 percent gap of toilet in this Palika but Dhangadhimai Municipality conducted so to fulfill this gap and safely managed of the water, sanitation and hygiene for all people Palika is implementing ASWA-II program in all 14 wards.






